What's Your "One Thing?"

I don't know about you, but with a lot of things pulling our attention, it seems it's really hard to get up the motivation to be passionate about anything these days.

So much demands our attention that we tend to spend our days in a kind of auto-pilot "survival mode." We may consult our calendars and our lists to see what needs to get done immediately, but the idea of dreaming about or envisioning something else for ourselves seems . . . well, exhausting. Or maybe even pointless.

A few years back I began a program called the Soul Care Institute. Designed for pastors and ministry leaders, its intention was to give us the tools to prevent burn out in ministry. In our first week in person together, the professor asked us what our dreams were.

It stumped a lot of people.

We get on auto-pilot, and we know that's not ideal, but we don't always know what else to do. Stuff has to get done, right? The tyranny of the urgent is very real. So we don't make space to dream much anymore.

Last Fall when we walked together through our new Vision Statement, I asked you all what you were passionate about. And 35% all said the same thing - you are passionate about your family.

We do a good job serving families at this church. We do a lot of family-friendly events. We offer Trailblazers for younger children and youth group for older kids. Most recently, I've seen two different people take their passion and turn it into a service for families - one was offering sewing classes and another created Parent's Night Out once a month. I'm seeing people with a passion for baking, sewing, music, and crafts use that passion in service to others.

One thing the Soul Care Institute taught me is that when I am in survival mode, I don't dream about my future. I don't envision something deeper outside of myself and my circle of influence.

But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 3:13-14)

"One thing I do."

One thing.

Pressing on toward the goal to win the prize.

It can be easy to think that Paul is talking about the prize being salvation . . . which ultimately leads us to heaven. It's easy to read this and think about what sounds really good to us right now – in our overwhelmed, over-exhausted, over-scheduled, survival-mode life – eventually ending up in a place of perfection where there is no more pain and no more tears.

But the prize he is talking about is not heaven. It's not eternal life.

You know how I know that? Because Paul is saying that the goal is something HE is striving toward. And we cannot earn eternal life in heaven.

The prize is Christ himself.

The prize is the relationship with Jesus.

When was the last time you considered Jesus as the one thing you are passionate about?

When Jesus is our center, all the hopes and dreams and desires flow from that. When we remain in him we will bear fruit that most honors him. Which is the point – to be a reflection of God to the world, so that all may know him.

God gives us passions outside of ourselves – like our family, like jobs and hobbies – but if we do not center Jesus first, our

lives become disordered. Overwhelmed. Over-scheduled. Without Jesus, we simply run on survival mode.

To passionately pursue Jesus is to begin in the right place, to order our lives so we don't become disordered in our hearts.

May he always be our "one thing."

Summary: Board Meeting of April 6

Pastor's Stephanie's most recent doctoral class was on curriculum planning. She will be planning a five-week training series for the church based on two books by Thom Rainer, *Anatomy of a Revived Church*, and *Autopsy of a Deceased Church*.

General Fund offerings through March 31 are \$37,890.60, or \$2,953.65 below the budget goal of \$40,844.25. We still are feeling the effects of the two canceled worship services in February. Available unrestricted funds as of March 31 are \$17,295.50, with new unpaid bills amounting to around \$10,000.

The church gave \$200 to Our Savior Lutheran church to help with its food pantry. Peggy Schwetz has been added to the diaconate. Plans for summer outreach opportunities are being made.

The water pressure coming into the building from the street has been tested and is too high, which is the likely cause of recent water problems. A valve can be installed to regulate this.

A local business has donated enough to pay for one child to go to camp. A lasagna dinner on May 9 will raise more campership funds. The last day of Sunday school will be June 8. VBS will be August 17-19 at Nystroms Park. Sunday school children will participate in the worship services once a month.

Missions & Evangelism started a Monday night Zoom prayer meeting, which will be opened to wider participation once it is going well. The goal is to pray for God's help in reaching others.

The annual WM graduates picnic will be held in June

The Pastoral Relations Committee has reviewed Pastor Stephanie's performance and has set church ministry goals for 2025:

Church ministry goasl:

- Pastor Stephanie will develop short (5 minute) messages to post online;
- 2) Pastor Stephanie will assist CHYG with resources and curriculum;
- The pastor and the Diaconate will work together to improve congregational care, contacting active members of the congregation;
- 4) The pastor and the congregation will work together on outreach to peripheral people and the pastor will continue to help the congregation develop the needed skills for this;
- 5) In-person and Zoom Bible study classes will continue;
- 6) Pastor Stephanie will reach out to find ways the church can connect locally (food bank, library, schools, Opera House, etc.).

Pastor Stephanie's goals for 2025 include:

- 1) Continuing participation in BSF on Tuesday evenings;
- 2) Continuing morning prayer with her Soul Care community;
- 3) Spending one day per quarter near a body of water to commune with God;
- 4) Practicing 24 hours of silence monthly to commune with God;
- 5) Continuing her doctoral program at Trinity International University.
